


2023 ANPA Neuropsychiatry Bazaar

Dementia


SIG Chair: James "Trey" Bateman

Traumatic Brain Injury

The mission of the American Neuropsychiatric Association TBI Special Interest Group (ANPA TBI SIG) is to provide a forum for ANPA members to exchange information, develop educational and other scholarly activities by and for ANPA members and others interested in this topic, and to create a network of like-minded colleagues within our association. Near-term project for the ANPA TBI SIG include regular (at least every other month) Zoom meetings for networking, education (i.e., webinars, research-in-progress updates), and scholarly activities. The latter will include developing a TBI neuropsychiatry syllabus for trainees and practitioners; collaboration with the *Journal of Neuropsychiatry and Clinical Neurosciences* on a TBI-focused Editor's Choice: Curated Collection; development of *JNCN Podcasts* on TBI-focused articles published in that journal; and development of scholarly works addressing current topics in TBI neuropsychiatry. The ANPA TBI SIG is also seeking input from its members and the ANPA membership more generally on high-priority near-term TBI-focused projects that align with ANPA's mission "to improve the lives of persons with disorders at the interface of psychiatry and neurology."
