Deborah Rose, MD, is a Behavioral Neurology & Neuropsychiatry fellow at Johns Hopkins University. She completed her neurology residency at Duke. She specializes in the neuropsychiatric manifestations of neurodegenerative disorders, as well as mood and behavioral syndromes. Her research explores how early-life adversity influences cognitive and psychiatric outcomes across the lifespan and examines the impact of psychosocial factors on resilience and clinical expression in later life. Dr. Rose aims to integrate clinical neuroscience with population-based research to develop trauma-informed and culturally sensitive approaches to dementia care and neuropsychiatric syndromes.

Mohammad Lesanpezeshki, MD, is a Behavioral Neurology & Neuropsychiatry fellow at the University of Illinois Chicago. He earned his medical degree from Tehran University of Medical Sciences in Iran and completed psychiatry residency at Case Western Reserve University's MetroHealth Medical Center, where he served as Academic Chief Resident. He also trained in psychoanalytic psychotherapy through the Cleveland Psychoanalytic Center. His clinical and academic interests include brain-behavior relationships, suicide, neuroimaging, and interventional psychiatry. He is particularly interested in how biological and philosophical perspectives can be integrated to enhance patient care and deepen our understanding of psychiatric disorders.
